## Mixed Methods Research and Evaluation

<b>Description</b>	This workshop deals with methodological triangulation. We outline when, why, and how to combine and integrate qualitative and quantitative research methods. Our focus is primarily practical, which means that our main emphasis will be on exploring the possibilities and limits of mixing qualitative and quantitative methods based on concrete examples. The workshop will include lectures, practical exercises, and assignments.
<b>Objectives</b>	The aim is to introduce participants to the procedures, possibilities, and limits of combining qualitative and quantitative research methods. At the end of the workshop, participants will have an understanding of how mixing methods may contribute to a research project.
